**DEUTSCH – AMERIKANISCHER TAG  
GERMAN – AMERICAN DAY**

Ever since October 6 was first proclaimed German – American Day the organizations of German-American heritage have celebrated with a posting of their club colors at St. Benedict Church, 2215 W. Irving Park Road, Chicago. This year the commemoration was held on October 7, 2007 at 2:30 P.M.

The afternoon was begun with the different organizations marching in with their flags and that were posted in the front by the altar. Honorary President, Horst Lichtenberger and Treasurer, Rudy Frank carried our Schwaben Athletic Club flag. There were a total of 25 flags posted.

A very nice service followed the singing of both the National Anthems of the United States and Germany with the Men's Choir singing three songs, the children's choir singing several songs. The guest speaker, Dr. Raymond Arthur Lohne spoke of the German contributions to American history from the time of Abe Lincoln and the part they played at that time to the political scene. A trumpet solo and the Ladies Choir singing two selections followed this.

The Consul General, Federal Republic of Germany spoke next of the health of the German American Organizations across the United States. He implored the people to continue to try and retain the bilingual teachings with children so their pride and heritage is not lost.

The service was closed with the Mixed Choir singing three numbers and the audience singing the hymn "Great God, we love you!"

The whole service was very meaningful and inspiring of German American pride.

Referee **Richard Giebner**, has blown his final whistle. He died in his sleep Friday, October 5, 2007 at age 96. Dick enjoyed good health until quite suddenly (within a week) he developed full renal failure and was placed in a hospice.

Throughout his long career in soccer, Dick entertained those who knew with numerous stories. We enjoyed his offerings and know he is now with his love Heidi. He did not take his cards but has a remote to watch us and countless more TV games from Heaven. He will be cremated per his wishes, and his ashes will be scattered on some soccer field later on. He wanted no fuss over his death and left no instructions about memorials or donations. His address was 2524 E. Mabel Street, Tucson, AZ 85716. His daughter Mitzy still resides in Tucson.

Dick was the chapter founder of the Greater Chicago Chapter, National Intercollegiate Soccer Officials Association, referee assignor and clinician until 1977 when he retired at age 67 to Tucson. Dick was also a FIFA referee for 9 years, held various positions with Illinois State Soccer Association over a period of about 35 years: secretary, treasurer, Cup commissioner, referee training, etc. In the last 30 years Arizona referees, administrators and players benefited from Dick's help and guidance.
